Homily

The Nicene Creed Said in unison, all standing as able.

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE WINE - You can either,		
Office	DRINK	Hold the base of the chalice and guide it to your lips to drink the wine.
TE STE	INTINCT	Hold up the bread. The minister will take the bread, dip it for you, and hand it back to you.
	NOT RECEIVE	Cross your arms. The minister will hold the chalice up, but you will not drink.
Right Street	NON- ALCHOLIC	If you require non-alcoholic wine, clasp your hands. After drinking, hand the cup back.
